Born in Hungary in 1920, Zehava Daskal learned sewing in one of the leading couturiers in Budapest. During the Holocaust, she was assigned to sewing for the Germans before being transferred to Ravensbruck concentration camp for women. Following liberation, she made Aliyah with her husband Meir and resumed her craft at a leading Jerusalem boutique. In 1956 she relocated with her family to Kiryat Ata and sewed custom clothing for a broad clientele, but mostly for religious women and girls. She created fashionable dresses based on photos in fashion magazines. She was a true master of the needle and thread.

Zehava Daskal used her craft to help women of all socio-economic classes look dignified and elegant on every occasion.
